

# Free MBA Program for Minority Students

Wake Forest University has a MBA program that provides [free tuition, fees, a stipend and a job](#) for minority students who want to earn their MBA. The new scholarship for minority students is the Corporate Fellowship. [The Corporate Fellowship provides full tuition and \\$21,000 stipend to cover the students living expenses. The Fellows will participate in a practicum that has two components, educational and professional development.](#) Students are assigned a mentor, a high-level executive with their sponsor corporation. Each student will complete a research project under the direction of his or her mentor. The professional development component of the fellowship provides career coaching and leadership development. The goal of the sponsoring corporation is to hire the student as a full time employee. The student is not obligated to work for the corporation; however, if they are interested, it is a job opportunity with a major corporation.

Tribal Descendants and Tribal members this is an opportunity to get a [FREE](#) education and to be [PAID](#). The GMAT is not necessary. They have the money to help minority students. They need applicants.

## Eligibility Requirements

1. Applicant must hold or be pursuing a bachelor's degree from an accredited college or university.
2. Applicant's major must be in the liberal arts, sciences or engineering disciplines (applicants with business or business-related majors are not eligible for this program; business minors are eligible to apply).
3. Applicants must have graduated from college on or after May 2009 and have less than 12 months of full-time post-graduate work experience.
4. Applicants who have been enrolled in an academic program as a full-time student since college graduation are eligible to apply.

The Master of Art in Management program is specifically for liberal arts majors only. It is a ten-month intense study of the basic areas of business. After graduation and working approximately two years, all MBA graduates are eligible to apply to Wake Forest as part of the MA/MBA joint degree Program and get the MBA in one year.
