It is an opportunity for students to gain hands-on skills with EPA or other governmental and tribal environmental offices. Requirements:

- U.S. Citizen
- Full-time student (12-hrs. undergrad, 9- hrs. graduate) with satisfactory academic standing.
- Major in environmental or related field such as science, engineering, planning, policy, law, management, political science, anthropology, health. etc.
- Proficient verbal and written communication skills
- Interested in working with Native American tribes or topics.

Intern Projects will focus on Air Quality issues with a wide range of emphasis areas such as:

- Community Outreach/Education
- Environmental Health
- Information Collection/Data Analysis
- Environmental Justice
- Youth Environmental Education

Intern Duties:

- Assist EPA/Tribal agencies with environmental issues.
- Acquire ready-to-use skills.
- Gain actual experience while contributing to a project.
- Earn \$4000 during a ten-week experience.
