

PCI Education Department's Youth Services



After School Tutoring-After school tutoring will begin in **September** each year.

The After School tutoring program is available to all eligible Tribal member and 1st generation students who have a C or below on their Report Card/Progress Report or the recommendation of a teacher and who are in the 1st-6th grade.



Homework Club-is an all-around academic program that offers tutoring services, homework help, computer lab usage, and special project help to Tm and 1st generation students in the 1st- 12th grade. Homework Club hours are offered from 5:00-7:30 p.m., Monday-Thursday during the school year and will begin at the beginning of school in August each year.



Close Up- this program is a week long look at Political life in Washington D.C. Selected students will be in the 9th-12th grade and must be 15 years old at the time of application. Applications will be made available beginning **in/or around August** each year and will be posted to the Tribe's website and/or you can pick one up at the PCI Education dept.



4-H- this Educational program features two monthly meetings with an emphasis on "learning by doing". Meetings are held on the 2nd and 4th Mondays of each month throughout the year with special field trips included. Special programming is held throughout the summer as well!



4-H Steer program- a youth centered, educational program that is provided by the Poarch Creek Indians through the Poarch Creek 4-H Club. Through this program, the 4-H'er will work with a selected animal (steer/heifer) that weighs approximately 400-500 pounds and will care for it, which will include daily feeding and training until he weighs about 1200 pounds, at which time the animal will be shown in the local Escambia County, AL, Steer Show and sold at the premium sale after the show. This program will begin in/around **August** each year.



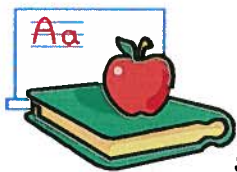
Incentive Program- this program awards Tribal Member and 1st generation youth in grades K-12th who have achieved A, A/B honor Roll, or have attained perfect attendance on their Report Card. This program will begin when the first Report cards have been distributed for the school year. A special end of the year celebration will be held for those students who maintain A, A/B Honor Roll and/or perfect attendance for the whole year!



Summer Reading program-this program is held during the months of June and July each summer for children in Pre-K-6th grade. Each week a selected storybook is featured along with activities related to the book! Movie nights and special guest speakers are also featured! We offer incentives for reaching summer reading goals!



Summer Camp Program-this program is provided for Tribal Member and 1st generation youth for financial assistance to help cover the cost of summer camp. Tribal Member students are eligible for up to \$500.00 and first generation students are eligible for up to \$250.00 worth of assistance.



Summer Tutoring-this program is made available to any Tribal student who needs academic assistance or to keep skills learned during the previous school year fresh! Summer tutoring is available during the months of June and July each year.
