
Master of Tribal Administration and Governance



The program is offered through the University of Minnesota as a combination of online classes and several weekend meetings per semester (every three weeks) in order accommodate working professionals. It is an applied professional development degree program designed to Tribal people who work or would like to work as an administrator in tribal government or as a Tribal Leader. The curriculum is based on the roles that tribal leaders and professionals perform in formal and informal situations that support tribal sovereignty and selfdetermination. The graduate students are expected to complete a sequence of courses totaling 38 credits. The curriculum includes classes on principles of tribal sovereignty; tribal budgets, finance and accounting; principles of tribal management; federal Indian law; and leadership and ethics.

Admission and Application Requirements

- Preferred minimum GPA of 3.0; Bachelor's degree
- Personal statement (300 words)
- Two letters of recommendation
