The Indians Into Medicine Program (INMED™) located at the University of North Dakota, Grand Forks, is a comprehensive program designed to assist American Indian students who aspire to be physicians and other health care professionals to meet the needs of our tribal communities.

Through a unique agreement between the University of South Dakota Sanford School of Medicine and the University of North Dakota School of Medicine and Health Sciences, prospective American Indian medical students have an increased opportunity of acceptance by applying to both medical schools through the INMED Program. In addition, INMED students have access to academic services to support their success.

The INMED Program provides the following services:

- Student support and advising services
- Learning resource center
- Financial aid advisement
- Tutoring

To date, INMED has graduated 228 medical doctors. The program also enrolls students in nursing, Clinical Psychology, and various other healthcare specialties. A total of 489 American Indian healthcare professionals have graduated through the INMED Program, and many additional American Indian students have received career and academic counseling or referral from INMED Program staff.
